



Purge Job History Plugin


This plugin provides the ability to purge all the build records of a job either via a CLI command or via the UI. When this plugin is installed it adds a new action to all Jobs *with builds*,

Purge Build History:

The functionality is also exposed as a CLI command:



Command purge-job-history

```
java -jar jenkins-cli.jar -s http://localhost:8080/jenkins/ purge-job-history JOB [-r]
```

Purge the build history of a job

```
JOB : Name of the job whose history should be purged  
-r  : Also reset the next build number to 1.
```

In either case the user invoking the action needs to have the **R un/Delete** permission

on all builds in the job in order for the operation to succeed.
